Higher School Certificate

Summary:

- Projected UAI figures indicate that 14% of the 2008 Candidature will score UAI Results of 90 or more
- These results qualify our students for entry to their desired University Courses: Medicine, Nutrition and Sports Science, Engineering, International Studies
- 20% of the Scots Candidature achieved Band 6 Results
- 52% of the Scots Candidature achieved Band 5 or Band 6 Results
- 77% of the Scots Candidature achieved Band E3 or E4 in Extension Subjects
- 20% of the Scots Candidature have gained early entry to their chosen courses
- 15% of the Scots Candidature have gained GAP Placement for 2009
