- b. Attend the examination if at all possible. The existence of **both** an examination mark (however affected by illness or misadventure) **and** an assessment mark provide the school with the maximum amount of data to make a fair decision for the student.
- c. Obtain all possible documentation regarding the illness or misadventure, e.g. doctor's certificate, accident report on the day of the illness or misadventure. This will support the illness or misadventure appeal for the examinations occurring in the period affected.
- d. Provide Mrs Fleming with copies of all documents.

Students have been issued with an examination timetable and are required to present for the examination 15 minutes before the scheduled start.

This Week in History . . .

98 years ago Australia was first brought into World War One by the British Empire in August 1914 as Britain was preparing to declare war on Germany. At the time Andrew Fisher (Past Prime Minister, leader of the Labor Party and became the Australian prime minister again in September 1914) promised that Australia would stand behind Great Britain (known as the mother country). He believed this war to be a noble cause where Australians could demonstrate their loyalty.

The Australians offered 320,000 troops to the service of Great Britain. In the end Britain didn't only call for Australia's troops but asked several other countries of the then British Empire to help them because at the time Britain didn't have a big enough army. With Australia both Canada and India provided troops. India supplied over a million troops to help great Britain fight the Germans.

Such was the incredible dedication that was felt towards the British Empire. Australia's dual loyalty was evident in the name of the volunteer force formed in September 1914, the Australian Imperial Force (AIF). Its first members sailed for the war in November 1914.

The war lasted for 4 years and with delight to the 3 countries that contributed and supplied troops for Britain's benefit, the war was won. British forces pushed back the Germans, forcing them to surrender.

Having been here thirty years, I still tend to think of the Dining Hall as new, but it is in fact thirty-one years old, and over the past few years it has been necessary to replace nearly all of the equipment in the kitchen. The replacement process began a few years ago with a new stove. Catering Manager Mrs. Moira Robertson promised the then Bursar, Mr. Greg Shapter, a big kiss if he got her a new stove. He delivered, and I believe so did she! Since then, old refrigeration equipment, and ovens have been replaced. The newest oven arrived earlier this year. Over the last holidays, two new gas deep fryers were installed. They replaced two elderly electric ones for which spare parts were no longer made. The oldest item of equipment in the kitchen is an electric potato peeler. It is quite ancient, having been moved to the present Dining Hall from the old one (the now-demolished old Music Centre). It consists of an electric motor, a great deal of cast iron and a tap. It is a simple piece of equipment, and is regarded with great fondness by the Dining Hall ladies, who see no need to replace it.
