Illness and Misadventure: Should illness or misadventure occur in the examination period it is vital that the following protocols are observed:

b. Attend the examination if at all possible. The existence of **both** an examination mark (however affected by illness or misadventure) **and** an assessment mark provide the Board of Studies with the maximum amount of data to make a fair decision for the student.

c. Notify the Presiding Officer of an illness or misadventure appeal for the current and upcoming examinations at the conclusion of the first examination affected by illness or misadventure. The Presiding Officer will keep his/her own documentation and provide the candidate with documentation pertaining to the illness or misadventure.

d. Obtain all possible documentation regarding the illness or misadventure, **e.g. doctor's certificate, accident report on the day of the illness or misadventure**. This will support the illness or misadventure appeal for the examinations occurring in the period affected.

e. Provide Mrs Lynne Fleming with copies of all documentation.
