




PHOTOS FOR 'THE LION'

I am thoroughly delighted to receive photos for 'The Lion' from activities that I have not been able to attend myself. I would like to pass on a few tips that make it more likely that photos will be published.

Firstly, photos need to be in high resolution. Compressed and low resolution photos can be used for small illustrations, but higher resolution files are better for larger colour photos. The internet system has difficulty coping with too many of these sent at once. I find that 8 MB usually moves successfully, and there has also been some successes with 15 MB. If the total size of the files exceeds 15 MB, the photos are best submitted on a disc.

Secondly, some pre-selection of photos is appreciated. I was once handed a disc with over 200 photos on it! A selection of the best dozen or so is a good guideline.

A few other tips: the usual standard in newspapers and other publications is no more than three people in a photograph. Sometimes exceptions are made to this, but a photo with about three people is best. Photos (especially of sporting events) need to have the subject's face reasonably visible (no back views!).

Please note that photos sent in for *The Highlander* (particularly those taken at sports events) should contain only students from The Scots School. Students from other schools must be unrecognisable or cropped out in order to comply with privacy legislation regarding photos of children. Please send photos separate to a story, not embedded in a Word document.

Finally, the closer the photographer is to the subject the better!

The Scots School Bathurst – North West Equestrian Expo 2013 (Coonabarabran)

On Thursday the 30th of May, two young riders, Jack Rowlandson (yr 10) and Danielle Lord (yr 8) travelled to Coonabarabran with their horses to represent The Scots School Bathurst in one of the largest interschool equestrian competitions in Australia.

The expo ran for 5 days, involved 620 riders and over 700 horses from across the state and included a large variety of equestrian disciplines including dressage, show jumping, cross country eventing, polocrosse, working horse challenge and team penning to name a few.

Both our young riders represented our school with dedication, pride and absolute sportsmanship, particularly when they participated in composite teams made up from other schools.

Some of the highlights include; Jacks composite team, penning three head of stock in the fastest time to win the event against more than 30 other teams, Danielle and Jack teaming up with two other riders to come 7th in the team 6 Bar Jumping against more than 30 other teams, Jacks composite team achieving 4th place overall in the Polocrosse against some skilled and fast paced competition, Danielle achieving a new personal best in Jumping with a height of 1.25 metres and completing her run in the team barrel race in under 19 seconds.
