I urge Year 12 students to consult with me to ensure that they have provided for as many possible paths of study as are available to them. Similarly students with issues for EAS applications need to consult with me regarding completion of these applications.

Year 11

The Year 11 examinations are taking place this week, Week 9 (beginning 9th September). I remind students that a grade will be submitted to the Board of Studies for each course of study and will be recorded on the ROSA.

Illness and Misadventure: Should illness or misadventure occur in the examination period it is vital that the following protocols are observed:

- a. Notify Mrs Lynne Fleming **immediately** of the illness or misadventure. Mobile phone number 0412 910 861.
- b. Attend the examination if at all possible. The existence of **both** an examination mark (however affected by illness or misadventure) **and** an assessment mark provide the Board of Studies with the maximum amount of data to make a fair decision for the student.
- c. Obtain all possible documentation regarding the illness or misadventure, e.g. doctor's certificate, accident report on the day of the illness or misadventure.
- e. Provide Mrs Lynne Fleming with copies of all documentation.

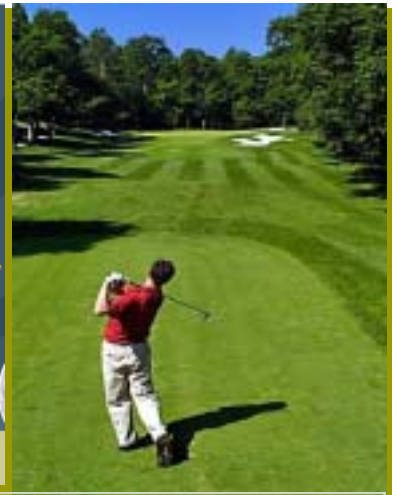
