**The Junior School bike day was held last Friday on a perfect Spring day.** The Pre- Kindergarten children made their way down to the tennis courts where they were able to have a general ride around and also try out a small obstacle course. The K-6 children were split into three groups and participated in a range of activities. The first was an obstacle course set up on the front drive that tested out the children's balancing ability, stopping ability, scanning, steering control, ability to judge distance and also the ability to dodge objects. The second challenge was a general road safety challenge to see how much the children pay attention to every day signs that appear on our roads. There were Stop, Give Way, One Way and Pedestrian signs that had to be matched

up with the relevant road markings. There were various speed signs and other warning signs including correct and incorrect ones for the children to decipher. The third was a general ride around the main oval at the back of the school, with reports from some kids that they completed 21 laps of the oval in their 20/30 minute time slot!!
