We welcome all the new students and their families to Scots and welcome back to our returning students and families. A few of our summer sports teams resume their seasons after a very short first week and all sports will be back on the courts and fields next weekend.

Sport Training and Sport leave expectations

The start of the year is a fine time to remind the students of the expectations of them for sport training sessions.
