YEAR 9 (BOYS ONLY) SCHOOL VACCINATION for 2014



Year 9 Boys Only

**DON'T BE LATE,
VACCINATE**

Each year NSW Ministry of Health (in conjunction with NSW Department of Education and Training) offers the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school-based vaccination program.

In 2014 the following vaccine will be offered to
Year 9 male students:

- **Human Papillomavirus (HPV) - Yr 9 boys ONLY**
This vaccine will offer some protection to young males against genital cancers and also genital warts.

The vaccine requires 3 doses to be effective, so the vaccination clinics are spread over a 6 month period.
Vaccine FREE while student in Year 9 ONLY

CLINICS

Qualified Accredited Nurse Immunisers attend each school to provide vaccinations for students as per the NSW Immunisation Schedule (usually 3 clinics per year)



Parents / Carers

- Ask your child for the Consent Pack sent home from school
- Read information in Parent Information Kit
- Check your child's vaccination records
- Complete and sign consent form in **blue or black pen ONLY**
- Give completed consent to student to hand in at school
- Give **copy** of vaccination record to your GP

- Eat a good breakfast on morning of vaccination
- Give parent/carer your completed vaccination record

Boys Winter Uniform

As you may be aware, the school is no longer able to source the grey moleskins for boys, resulting in a change of trousers commencing in second term. The school has selected a grey trouser with reinforced knees for younger students, which will be worn with black shoes. To avoid any inconsistency in style, colour etc. the regulation grey trousers for winter may **only be purchased from the School Shop**. There will be a phasing in period of 2 years to allow those who have moleskins time to wear them out. Mrs Weal will be ordering stock this week in time for second term.

Is dried fruit OK for Crunch&Sip*?

Although fresh fruit is the best choice, a small amount of dried fruit (eg sultanas or apricots) is an acceptable Crunch&Sip* option.

Dried fruit tends to cling to the teeth, so is best eaten with a meal or when a toothbrush is handy.

NOTE fruit straps, bars or rolls are **NOT** permitted as they contain large amounts of sugar.



Mobile Phones/I Phones

Junior School students who need to have a mobile phone for travel/ safety purposes must leave the device in their bag during the time they are at school. The school will not take responsibility for damage or loss of such items and teachers will confiscate them if students are found to be using them at school. If children need to contact parents by phone for any reason, they should speak to their teacher who will assess the request and organise the call if necessary. Excursion notes will explicitly state whether or not electronic devices should be taken.

Welcome- The Pre-Kindergarten students are settling in very well to our new routines and daily program. It has been wonderful to have had a full week of classes under way so that we have now met all of our families and their children.

We have had lots of singing activities and games for children to get to know their classmates' names.

Learning Program- This week we will continue our learning program to get to know our students and their families with our theme "All About Me". We will be graphing eye and hair colours that are in our classroom, looking at pets, favourite foods, finishing off self portraits and lots more.

Parking /Drop Off- We would like to remind our Pre-Kindergarten families that our day commences at 8.30am with our learning program starting at 9am. The front driveway is just for quick drop off's of 5 minutes and less. Alternatively the parking at the back of the school (next to the Health Centre) is for a longer period of time. For afternoon pick up, if you are collecting your child **between 3.10- 3.35pm** you are required to use the back parking zone. This will reduce the congestion for the school buses on the front driveway.

SCOTS STEPS UP TO THE PITCH FOR PINK STUMPS DAY TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE MCGRATH FOUNDATION
