## *From the Headmaster . . .*

Geoffrey Herbert Bromfield

### **Headmaster's Farewell Address at School Assembly – 18 June, 2014**

I am here today to honour Mr Geoff Bromfield for his many years of dedicated service to The Scots School. Mr Bromfield retires on 11 July, while we are on holidays. He has been employed at The Scots School for almost 43 years.

He started on 7<sup>th</sup> October 1971 – at age 27 years old, as a carpenter. He was employed by Les Brown the Bursar and worked under his uncle Les Bromfield who was Head of Maintenance. He was paid \$3.50 per hour or \$140 per week which equates to \$7280 per year.

He was appointed Supervisor of Maintenance and Grounds on 25<sup>th</sup> February 1980. His annual salary for this role was increased to \$12,000p.a.

In December 1981, as a sign of gratitude for his work, he was given a full tank of petrol each week. This lasted for about two years.

Buildings that he built with his uncle and after his uncle retired or buildings he project managed are as follows:

- Rooms 24 & 25 before the English quad was built.
- Thompson Cottage
- Main Oval Scoreboard
- Aikman Hall
- Top floor of the Science block
- Chaplain's House
- Design & Technology Block
- Day House
- New Pool

### *From the Headmaster . . . continued*

His association with the school began long before he was employed in 1971. When he was a school boy he worked with his uncle in digging the foundations for the Headmaster's House in his school holidays in the late 1950s.

He bought a car in his second week here in October 1971. He still drives the same car today - 43 years with one car up and down the Western Highway from Yetholme every day!

I first met Mr Bromfield in 2010 at the symbolic turning of the first sod for the new swimming pool. I remember what he said to me: "You are the 10<sup>th</sup> Headmaster in my time here and I have also worked for 8 Business Managers".

Mr Bromfield was employed by Mr Aikman (Aikman Hall); he worked for Mr Hunter (Hunter Sports Centre) for 17 years; and Mr Lamrock, Headmaster for six years and current Chairman of the School Board (Lamrock Performing Arts Centre).

Mr Bromfield has a wealth of knowledge in his head which will be greatly missed. He has had to spend a great deal of time transferring much of this information to the new Head of Maintenance, Mr Jeff Reekes or young Jeff as we refer to him. I wish Geoff Bromfield all the best in his retirement and thank him for his many years of loyal service to the school.

Would you all stand to acclaim Mr Bromfield's years of service to our school and wish him and his wife Barbara all the best in their retirement?

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**Stage 3 departed today for a very busy three days in Canberra under the leadership of Mrs Robinson and Mrs Inglis.** The students will be kept extremely busy with a rich variety of Canberra experiences from the War Memorial, National Art Gallery, Questacon, the historical old Parliament House and, of course, Parliament House itself. For some of our students this will be their first visit to our Nation's Capital and this excursion gives them a much greater appreciation and sense of reality of the work they have been studying in class this year.

**It is hard to believe that we are half way through the school year and that Year 12 only has 11 weeks of school before their HSC Examinations commence.** I wish all students a well-deserved two week break and time with family and friends. For Year 12, I wish you all the best as you complete Major Works and assessments for submission and study for the HSC Trials in August. There is a lot of work to be done: be organised, follow the Study Plan provided by Mrs Fleming and find some time for recreation and rejuvenation. It won't be long before School will be behind you and the opportunities of the future beckon!


