## *From the Headmaster . . .*

**The Bathurst Open Day is next Saturday, 23 August from 11am-2pm.** This is a very important day in our School calendar where we all have the opportunity to promote The Scots School. I ask all parents and students to let friends and neighbours know so they are able to come and have a look at the school. There will be curriculum displays including student work samples, co-curricular displays, School tours and the opportunity to meet teachers and senior staff. The Pre-Kindergarten class room will also be in operation from 11am-12 noon with teachers and children present.

Next weekend is also the Term 3 Parent Weekend which features the Winter Season Presentation Dinners with the Netball Dinner and Presentation on Friday night and the Girls Soccer and Rugby Dinners and Presentation Night on Saturday. I look forward to catching up with many of you at these three dinners.

Ability Links is a new state government initiative which kick started on July 1<sup>st</sup>, and CareWest is excited to be offering the ability links program within Central West NSW. Ability Links offers a new way to support people with a disability (aged between 9 - 64 years), their families and carers especially those who are not traditionally known to the disability service system. The program assists people to access community and mainstream services, knowledge, resources and opportunities in their communities, to enable them to live the life they choose.

### **How it works?**

Ability Links coordinators known as Linkers provide a locally based first point of contact in communities to improve access and engagement. Ability Links does not require an assessment (It is not needs based). It targets those who are not traditionally known to the disability service system. Ability Links is not a Case Management Service.

Linkers have three main roles:

Work with people with a disability, their families and carers to plan for their future;

Work with people and their families to help them become more confident, supporting them to achieve their goals by building new networks and accessing support and services in their community; and

Work alongside communities and mainstream services, supporting them to become more welcoming and inclusive.

Anyone can contact their local Linker. The Linker does not need proof of diagnosis or a referral. The program has no assessment or eligibility criteria and is not time-limited.

## **Junior School News**

The team had an excellent day at All Saints on Wednesday, bringing home lots of place ribbons and good stories about their enjoyable experience. Thank you to Mrs Inglis who managed the team and to our CSU students who acted as officials on the day. The students looked fantastic in their athletics singlets and parents are reminded that it is compulsory to have a singlet for HICES in 2 weeks time.

All athletes need to compete in athletics singlet, black sport shorts, skins or plain black bike pants and white school sport socks. Full track suit, with jacket zipped, should be worn for travelling to and from the carnival. The importance of consistency and high standards in uniform cannot be underestimated and your cooperation is appreciated.

### **After School Supervision**

Children attending after school care are reminded that they need to take their homework or a book to read.

### **Healthy Food**

A healthy diet is vital to success in learning and in establishing life long patterns of a healthy lifestyle. We are seeing the benefits of this with our 'Crunch and Sip' program and the food we see in the lunch boxes however there are still some children who bring a great deal of processed sugary snack foods as part their lunch box each day. I would like to encourage parents to eliminate these snacks and pack only healthy food; it will benefit your child in the long term.

### **Authors and Illustrators' Competition**

All students from Kindergarten to Year 6 will commence the Authors and Illustrators Award this week. Children will write, edit, illustrate and publish a story during class time over the next two weeks. Emphasis will be on individual creativity and writing skills which will also be the criteria given to the judging panel. Stories and art work will be presented to parents at the Student Led Conferences at the end of the term. Winners will be announced and presented with their awards later in Term 4. Winning art works will be featured in our Art Gallery along with their stories.

### **Peer Support**

Our first group session went very well on Friday. Leaders were well prepared and managed their groups impressively. Information brochures about 'Resilience' were sent home to families last week. This week the children will have an opportunity to discuss their personal qualities and strengths. The children will identify their qualities and acknowledge how they contribute to their achievements. Through activities children recognise they used their strengths to achieve success and can be encouraged to approach future activities optimistically. Ask your own child to describe their own qualities and strengths so you can recognise and acknowledge these.

### **Being Prepared for Learning**

One of our school rules is 'Bring the correct equipment to school' and the majority of students comply with this, however there are some students who do not have even the most basic equipment such as a pencil, eraser and ruler to undertake their lessons each day. I would ask parents to regularly check the state of their children's stationery supplies and replace or maintain the items in their pencil case. Clearly labelling all items assists students to keep track of their belongings. Teachers are constantly reminding children how to look after their things and put them away after use. The school diary is another vital organisational tool and parents of younger students do a great job of assisting their child's learning by communicating through the diary and ensuring that it comes back and forth to school each day. Older students however need to begin to take more responsibility for this communication and must have the diary at every lesson or to visit the clinic. Homework, reminders, behavioural comments and changes in routine need to be recorded in the diary and therefore it is critical that it is available each day. Diaries should be kept in good order and if lost will be replaced at cost to the student.
