The Scots Pavilion Update

After having our launch of the Pavilion project and the positive response we have received from the School Community, we can now give you an update on the progress of this project.

The new Scots Pavilion will provide a range of benefits to the whole School Community, it is a much needed amenity that will provide many uses and give us and our Children a state of the art resource adjacent to the Junior School and Main Oval.

To date we have;

- Finalised the Design and Site Location
- Submitted documentation to Bathurst Regional Council for Development Consent.
- Finalised the design of the new Sewer line route to connect into the Pavilion.
- Assisted the School in a Grant Application BGA Funding, we are hoping to get a significant amount toward the Project of up to \$250k, we will know in September if we were successful.
- Our Parent Groups and the Old Boys and Girls Association have all established fund raising targets and committed to Fund.
- We have approximately \$47,000 of our targeted \$150,000 needed.

We need to raise this \$150,000 to complete the Pavilion project. This will be achieved through a combination of cash donations (which are tax deductible), in-kind donations and Parent & Friends fund raising efforts.

If we are able to raise sufficient funds for the Pavilion over the next few months, we plan to begin work on the Pavilion in October, so that it will be ready for the Scots School 70th Anniversary in early 2016.
