A reminder about procedure for Boarder Leave:

1. Please contact the Head of House in regards to leave by phone, email or fax (text messages not acceptable)

Stress Free Cattle Course . . .

On Monday the 1st of September and Tuesday the 2nd, 22 students from year's 9 to 12 participated in a Low Stress Stock-handling school. On Monday they learnt the theory of moving and working with stock to reduce the stress on both the animal and the handlers, to help increase productivity and cost efficiency of stock management.

On Tuesday they travelled to Glanmire to put their new skills into practice. It involved working with approx. 100 steers and moving them to and through the yards before finally testing their skills by having to move 5 head through an obstacle course.

Many thanks must go to Mr Grahame Ree's who ran the course and reduced the cost and length of the course for us. Also Mrs Donnelly for driving us to Glanmire and Mrs Dawes for helping organise and co-ordinate the day.

Agriculture . . .

The Year 11 Agriculture Class had their “Out West” excursion and adventure on 19-21 August. Day one involved us going to the Cowra Abattoirs, where we learnt the process chain of sheep, pigs and cows - from Slaughter to Market. From here we journeyed to Parkes to have a quick lunch and then headed straight to Trangie Research Station. At the Trangie Research Station we learnt about the trials and research being conducted



on the performance of specific sheep breeds and Methane Trial-experiments to try and reduce the methane emissions from livestock through genetic selection. We also saw plant trials in motion - weed and herbicide trials, direction of sowing trial, wheat species trials (24 varieties being tested) and a major trial on the time of sowing wheat. Our group is pictured above at Auscott in front of a giant cotton bale.

Wednesday morning we arose early and headed out to meet Nick Powell at the Narromine Irrigation Scheme. The Irrigation Scheme has recently had a major update to improve performance rates. We were then taken out to The Crawford’s farm where we learned about drip irrigation and their involvement with the Narromine Irrigation Scheme. They grow cotton so we were also given a talk about the cotton industry and the invention of genetically engineered cotton. After lunch at the Nevertire Pub we ventured out to Warren to visit AUSCOTT where we further learnt about the cotton industry and the process of ginning cotton after it is harvested. Later that afternoon we travelled to Trangie to visit a local cattle breeder Austin Steer, who has currently donated two of his steers to The Scots School. Austin gave us a talk on his breeding programme and the reproductive technology he utilises to



get the best possible progeny. Here we also selected a steer for Sydney Royal next year to incorporate into our cattle programme.

On the final day we went straight to the Dubbo Sale Yards after leaving our accommodation in Narromine. Here we were spoken to by Graham Board about the marketing techniques, auctioning techniques and sale techniques at the yards and the process of it all and learnt about the two different types of sales, the fat sales and store sales. After here we went down the road to Fletchers Abattoir to see the process of sheep slaughter and meat production. Here we learnt about the

marketing process as Fletcher is a pure export market and none of the lamb is sold in Australia.

We would like to thanks Mrs Dawes for all her hard work in organising this trip! It was fun and will certainly help us next year in our studies.

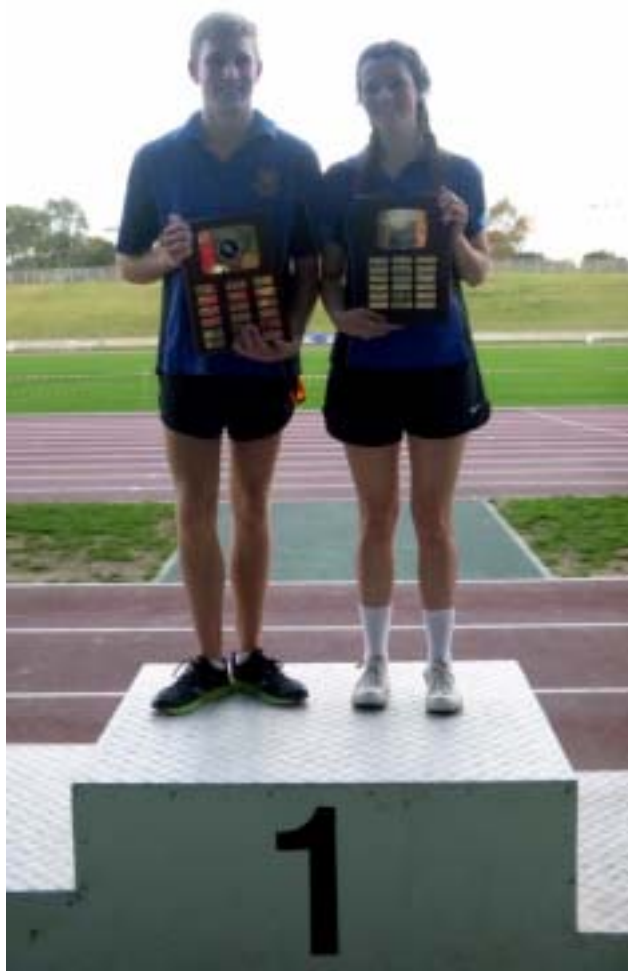
