From the Headmaster . . .

I am delighted with the enthusiasm for Operation Christmas Child that has been evident over the last few weeks. Students right across the School were asked to put together a shoe box of gifts to be given as a present to a child in a third world country. This initiative of the organization Samaritan's Purse requires a shoe box to be filled with six different types of gifts for a particular chosen age group and gender - something to love, something to wear, something to play with, something for personal hygiene, something for school and something special.

Some students put a whole box together themselves, some did it as a family and some did it with a couple of friends. This was a fabulous educational opportunity and a great way to reflect on how fortunate we are in Australia. In all, 116 boxes were put together and collected by Samaritan's Purse last week. The photo below shows some of our Pre-Kindergarten through Year 6 students with the collection of Christmas boxes ready to be collected.



All of you will be aware of the P & F desire to raise the necessary funds to build The Scots Pavilion overlooking the Main Oval. This has been the dream of previous P & F committees over the last six years and it has been the task of the current P & F Executive and P & F Pavilion Fundraising Committee to make this a reality in 2015. To complete this task, approximately \$600,000 is required and we are getting close.

We have just been informed that our application for Block Grant Authority funding from the Federal Government has been successful. The BGA has recommended we receive \$200,000 towards this project and we are just waiting for Federal Government final approval.

A condition for receiving this \$200,000 is that the building must commence construction in 2015.

Therefore, our current funds available for this project are as follows:

1. BGA Funding	\$200,000
2. P & F	\$149,000
3. Old Boys' & Girls' Association Chapel Fund	\$ 27,000
4. School Board	\$100,000
 Total October 2014	 \$476,000

The contributions of the Friends of Rugby and the Friends of Junior School to the P & F monies raised must be acknowledged here along with a few donations received from current families during the last six months.

There are a number of significant events planned for next year as fundraising initiatives which will involve broader communities than just our current School families and should raise a significant amount of money with sponsorship and auctions part of two of the events. The three most significant fundraising events are:

1. Sailing on the James Craig Tall Ship on Sydney Harbour on 7 March organised by the Old Boys' and Girls' Association with Mark Ella as guest speaker.
2. The Highland Gathering on Sunday 23 March.
3. 'Dinner with Nick Farr-Jones' on 16 May in Bathurst.

It is estimated that these three events will raise approximately \$55,000 between them.

I will be writing to all parents this week, and to companies with whom the School does business, asking for a commitment in donations. The P & F Fundraising Committee will also be contacting local businesses for donations and agreements for goods and services in kind.

I am asking all School families to support this fundraising to make this a reality. In my letter, I will be asking all School families to commit to giving a tax deductible donation of at least \$400. Of course, I am hoping that some will give much more than this as some families have already done.

It is vital we all work together to support The Scots School P & F in their desire to make this project a reality. A few people have been doing a great deal of work and it is vital we support them and raise the necessary funds to ensure the BGA funding of \$200,000 otherwise the task becomes much more difficult.

I have really enjoyed catching up with Year 12 students in my office after their last examination to reflect on how they felt they went and to share the joy of completion with them. I regard this opportunity as a real privilege and I take the opportunity to thank them for their many contributions to The Scots School during their time here. The last of the HSC examinations are this week and they are all looking forward to the Blue, Black & Gold Ball this Saturday. Well done Year 12!

The Blue, Black & Gold Ball is on Saturday 8 November. This is a wonderful whole school event held at BMEC. If you haven't been before, I encourage you to arrange a table with friends or contact Belinda Boshier who will find a spot for you possibly on a table with parents from your child's year group. Time is running out so contact Belinda early this week to arrange a ticket.
