From the Headmaster . . .

Thank you to the Pipes and Drums, Cadet Rank and the Junior School who represented the school at the ANZAC March in Bathurst last Saturday. Our Pipes and Drums led the march as usual with great distinction and our school was well represented.

We had 74 students (26% of the Bathurst Campus) involved in the ANZAC March with 22 Pipe Band members, 12 Cadets leaders, 40 Junior School students and 3 Senior School students in addition to the Pipe Band and Cadets. It was also good to have Caitlin McDermid march in uniform with our Cadets. Caitlin was School Captain in 2012 and CUO of Cadets in 2011 and is now studying Engineering and undertaking officer training through the Australian Defence Force Academy (ADFA).

Thank you also to the two School captains, Jessica Morrison and Hikari Hashida, who represented the school by laying the wreath at the 4.30am ANZAC Service in Bathurst.

We also had five students and the staff from Lithgow march in the Lithgow ANZAC Day Ceremony and they were joined by two of our Senior School students from Bathurst. Brooklin Jenkins and Marym Shawki from Lithgow were impeccable in the way they paused and reflected appropriately in the laying of the wreath. I wish to thank all the parents and students who made the effort to represent the School on this particularly significant occasion.



IMPORTANT NOTICES REGARDING LATE BOOKING REQUESTS:

Late bookings may be accepted for **Boarding Students travelling to their home address** up until the nominated amendment date. Late bookings will be assessed on a case-by-case basis based on train / coach occupancy and the ability for SSTS to safely complete the additional bookings. Late bookings cannot be guaranteed patronage on the SSTS coach services and preference will remain with the boarding students travelling home that made their booking requests by the nominated booking deadline.

To ensure the best chance of securing a seat on SSTS services, students should make their bookings by the submission date. For late bookings please advise our department at the earliest convenience and not wait until the final amendment date. Parents / Students requesting late bookings should also be advised to make a reservation on regular NSW TrainLink services (*phone 132232*) i.e train should we be unable to accommodate their request. Late bookings must be submitted on a separate booking request form submitted via email (*preferred*) or fax from the school.

SSTS understand that schools also have their own deadlines and requirements for student bookings. Whether you decide to advertise or accept late bookings is your individual choice. As previously mentioned, SSTS will only accept late booking requests via email (*preferred*) or fax directly from the school. Please do not advise parents to contact SSTS direct as it impacts on our ability to complete bookings for the students that made their requests on time and meet our own deadlines delivering safe and efficient transport.

This Week in History . . .

April 28th 1945 Death of Fascist Dictator

Ever since May 13 1943 when the last of the Axis forces were defeated in Africa, things were looking grim for the Italian Fascists. A massive invasion of Sicily on the July 10 assisted by a bit of British deception that made the axis think the assaults would be on Corsica and Sardinia allowed the establishment of an Allied Beachhead by . The Allies soon began to march along the peninsula and on the 24th Mussolini was deposed and captured and his successors soon began to pull away and surrender Italian troops and try to negotiate an armistice. However Mussolini was eventually rescued by German commandoes and became a German puppet ruler for Northern Italy, continuing in this role until the last German forces in Italy surrendered. After this he tried to flee to the Swiss border. But he was not successful and was captured by pro-ally Italian partisans on April the 27th and was executed the next day. His corpse was hung for public display in a Milanese Plaza. A nasty end for a nasty man.

Thankyou to all the Junior school students who participated in the ANZAC Commemorative Service at the War Memorial Carillon on Saturday. It was wonderful to see so many students commemorate more than a century of service by Australian servicemen and women in both conflict zones and peacekeeping operations. It was quite a lengthy service so I thank the students for their patience and participation in this event.

Uniform

The correct wearing of the uniform is very important at Scots. Learning to wear a uniform well and to care for it is an important part of training in self-discipline which is highly valued at our school.

The Kinder- Year 6 Handbook articulates the correct items that are to be worn as part of our uniform. Many of these items can be purchased at the school shop. With the exception of Kindergarten all students should be wearing black lace up shoes.

Last week it was noted that some students were wearing brown riding boots and moleskin style trousers. These are not part of our uniform and need to be replaced.

Boys should now be wearing grey trousers with a black leather belt. If your son, does not have these trousers then I ask that the next pair of trousers that you purchase are from the school shop. It is important that we are consistent with this and maintain our high standard.

In cold weather students **MUST** wear the Black parka with the lion emblem or a plain black jacket or coat to keep them warm.

Rugby and Netball Training

Training will continue on Wednesday afternoon at 3:30pm until 4:40pm. Children should bring all necessary equipment to school and change into their sport uniform before training in the afternoon. Rugby will be held on the main oval and Netball at the netball courts or in the Sports Barn depending on the weather.
