We wait, without grumbling about each other, so that we are not judged ourselves but are united and ready for our Lord's return.



This Week in History . . .

The battle of Anzen took place today in 838 AD, between the Byzantine armies and an Abbasid caliphate (from modern Turkey). It occurred as a result of the Byzantine Emperor Theophilos's progress into their own territory. The Abbasid forces tried to take a significant city called Amorion. The Byzantines were successful to begin with but Theophilos decided that he would go down to the front lines and lead the cavalry into battle, this causes the administration troops to panic thinking that he had been killed. These admin troops notified other officials who began to withdraw their battalions one by one while Theophilos and a small group of foot soldiers were being besieged in a Villa just outside a Amorion. As the Byzantine forces withdrew the Abbasid ones focused more on taking control of the city bit by bit, allowing Theophilos and his men to escape.

How big is the ice rink?


The ice rink is 10m x 25m and can have 100 skaters per session




Scots 3rds v. CSU




