Of course, what we have is due to the excellent foresight, planning and hard work of previous custodians of the school and it is our task to ensure the current generation of students, parents and staff does likewise.

The targeted area in the last few years has been along the back drive and around the Tennis Courts. I plan to complete the planting of this area this year so that we can move on to other areas of the School in future years.

This Week in History . . .

This week in History NASA achieved a lot. On the 27th of August 1962, the Mariner 2 probe was launched on a mission to Venus. It scraped to upper atmosphere and took readings as well as photos.

In 1981 the Voyager 2 space probe flew by Saturn (on the 26th of August) as close to the Gas Giant as it would get, sling-shotting behind it because of its gravity. It took photos that would be put together in a mosaic as well as scraping the upper atmosphere to take readings.

On the 25th of August 1989 it passed Neptune to do the same thing before rocketing on to where it is now, entering the very outer reaches of the Solar system, the Kuiper belt, possibly comprised of asteroids and dust.

Netball Finals

Last Saturday was the final round of netball matches before the semi-finals. This year every secondary school team was in contention to make the semi-finals in the final round. In the 14B competition both the Year 7 team and Year 8 team have made it through and will play each other this Saturday in the minor semi. So far this season they have beaten each other once so it promises to be a close match. The winner will progress through whilst the losing team will be eliminated. In the 16 B competition the Year 9 girls finished 4th and will also play in the minor semi-final. The girls have really improved throughout the season and have been playing some of their best games of the season in the last few weeks. The Year 10 girls finished 3rd in the 16 A division this year and will also play a minor semi-final against All Saints. In the senior grades the 3rd VII finished 5th in the B Res 2 grade. The 2nd VII finished tie 4th but missed the semi-finals on for and against goals. Disappointingly in the final game of the season the girls were convincingly beaten by 41 goals and they missed finishing 4th by 11 goals. Sadly the team that the 2nd's comfortably beat in the second last round progressed to the minor-semi-final. The 1st VII finished 2nd in their division and will play in the major semi-final this weekend. We hope that now the Trial HSC exams are over that we can have some solid training sessions with the whole team which will be vital so that the girls can play at their very best in the semi-finals.

We are very proud of our season and the development of our girls in all age divisions. Not so many years ago it was rare for a Scots team to make a semi-final. That said though we must not rest on our laurels and apply our very best concentration and effort in our preparation for the semi-finals and in the games. No doubt our coaches will be playing the strongest teams possible in the semi-finals and we ask that players be supportive of this attitude and be respectful to their teams mates, coaches, officials and the opposition players and supporters.
