20 June 1837 Victoria becomes Queen

King William IV had been king of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland as well as the German State of Hannover for seven years when he died at the age 71. It is a great irony that the successor of such a short-reigning monarch went on to be one of the longest reigning monarchs in history.

Victoria ruled over the British empire for 63 years, ending only with her death in 1901 at the age of 81. She was William's niece and the closest in line to the British throne, however due to a difference in the succession laws she was unable to inherit Hannover since she was female and so the title went to her uncle Ernest. Her reign began as a young princess, who had only just turned 18 on 24th May, being woken up and told that she was now the new queen, with her extravagant coronation taking place several months later. She could be considered the most important English monarch of the last 200 years, establishing the British monarchy as the centre of morality. Queen Victoria mothered nine children who all went on to marry into important noble houses across Europe. This gave her the moniker "the grandmother of Europe", and it should be noted that King George of England, Tsar Nicholas of Russia and Kaiser Wilhelm of Germany were all her grandchildren.

Pet assigned areas:

- 1. Dogs:** Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times and under the strict control of their owner. They should be kept at the northern end of the main oval until the parade is due to start. All dogs should be registered with Mr Hunter near the old canteen.
- 2. Cats:** Cats must be securely housed in their portable travel containers on the pavilion veranda. All cats should be registered with Mrs Jennie White at the pavilion.
- 3. Rabbits or Guinea Pigs:** Rabbits or guinea pigs must be securely housed in a relevant container at the southern end of the pavilion. All rabbits and guinea pigs should be registered with Mrs Willis.

4. Fish, mice, reptiles, hermit crabs or other small pets: Any pets such as these that are stored in glass or perspex containers will be stored in the pavilion. These pets should be registered with Mr Anthony Roohan.

5. Birds or Poultry: Any birds or poultry will be securely housed to the south of the pavilion near the guinea pigs and rabbits. Birds and poultry should be registered with Mrs Willis.

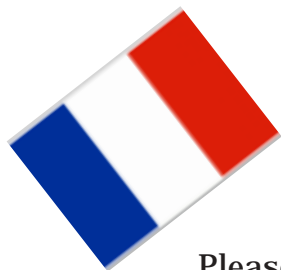
