



Equipment

Google Apps/ Google Classroom

All children in Year 2, Stage 2 and 3 have the opportunity to be provided with a Google Apps account. Students will also be assigned an email address to access a range of Google and other web based learning resources. This is all about providing a safe, engaging and collaborative online environment in which students can learn. Email addresses and passwords will be distributed to students once permission notes are returned.

ICAS Digital Technologies

Recently, 15 of our Junior School students took part in the ICAS Digital Technologies Assessment. Our students performed very well in the task achieving 1 Distinction, 6 credits and 2 merits. Premier's Reading Challenge concludes- 18th August

A big congratulations to those students who have already completed the Premier's Reading Challenge for 2017. There is just under a month to go and I encourage all students in the challenge to reach their goal and complete the challenge. Online records should be completed by the 18th August and the hard copy of the log should be given to Mrs Parnell or myself when completed.

Peer Support 2017

Peer Support sessions commenced last Friday. This year, our Year 6 students are leading a unit of work titled, 'Speaking Up' which focuses on an anti-bullying message. In the first session children met the members of their group and were introduced to a definition of bullying. They were asked to think about different types of bullying and examples of each including that involving use of the body, voice and mind. Students learnt that single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying. This week, students will learn more about the difference between conflict and bullying. Students will look at examples to see what constitutes bullying and what doesn't.

Woolworths Earn and Learn


