



CELEBRATING THE REFORMATION

This year marks the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther nailing his Ninety-Five Theses to the church door in Wittenberg, thus helping to pave the way for the Reformation and establishment of Protestant Denominations. Regardless of one's personal belief structure, the story of the Reformation is a fascinating one. At Easter it was my privilege to be in Geneva, where I was able to visit the Reformation Wall and Museum, as well as participate in some of the local activities to celebrate this significant part of European history.


YEAR 11 MOVING INTO YEAR 12 – TEXTBOOKS REQUIREMENTS

Junior School Bike Day 2017
