

Year 11 PDHPE Outdoor Recreation Excursion

Last term the Year 11 PDHPE class leant about many aspects of people's involvement in outdoor recreation. They covered aspects such as planning skills, applying risk management procedures to outdoor activities, environmental considerations, no trace camping practices, managing group dynamics and leadership styles. It was great that we were able to see some of these aspects of the course in the flesh with our excursion last Friday (13th Oct). The students started the day with a high ropes course at Trees Adventure. They were able to see how having strict safety procedures and expect instruction can make a somewhat dangerous activity – really safe. The students were challenged with the various levels of course set high up amongst the trees and had a heap of fun.

We then returned to the Evans lookout near Blackheath for our guided walk of the 'Grand Canyon' and 'Neates Glen'. Our expect National Parks Ranger, Jamie guided the students through the 3.5 hour walk stopping several times to explain things about the habitats, the wildlife, the physical environments and the diversity in the National Park.
