From the Headmaster . . .

The following staff have been employed or appointed internally to replace staff that are departing The Scots School at the end of the year:

Mr John Day will be the new Director of Boarding and Bulkeley Housemaster to replace Mr Duane Bailey who relinquishes this position after 12 years. Mr Day is currently Deputy Head at Macquarie Anglican Grammar School at Dubbo and prior to that was Head of Mathematics at Nowra Anglican College. Mr Day will also replace Ms Rachel Hughes at Head of Mathematics. Ms Hughes has been appointed as Assistant Principal at La Salle Academy in Lithgow.

Mr Duane Bailey will be the Stage 5 Welfare Coordinator. This year he has been responsible for Year 10 in addition to his responsibilities as Director of Boarding. He brings considerable experience to this important student welfare role.

Mr Ryan Barcham will join the teaching staff to teach Years 7-10 Mathematics and Christian Studies. He is a graduate from CSU where he has held the important role of President of Bathurst Christian Students for the last few years.

Mrs Charmeon Joost joins the teaching staff as Head of English and LOTE and will also teach Drama. Mrs Joost is currently the Head of Creative and Performing Arts at St Stanislaus College. She is a highly experienced teacher of English and Drama and has produced many school and community Drama Productions and Musicals. She is looking forward to producing the Musical *Oliver* at The Scots School next year.

Mrs Denise Nelson joins the teaching staff to replace Mrs Anne Denmead teaching EAL/D (English Additional Language/Dialect) and provide Mathematics Learning Support. *EAL/D* is the educational acronym that refers to those students whose home language is a language or dialect other than Standard Australian English (SAE) and who require additional support to develop proficiency in SAE. Mrs Nelson is currently a Learning Support Teacher at the MET School Orange Campus where she has also taught English and Mathematics. Mrs Denmead will remain on the staff next year in a part time role providing English Learning Support.

Ms Tracey Leaf is relinquishing the position of Head of English to pick up some of the responsibilities currently undertaken by Ms Rachel Hughes. Ms Leaf will be responsible for Year 12 Student Welfare and Academic Administration as part of her role as Head of Senior School/Deputy Head.

There are another three positions which will be determined in the next few weeks and announced in due course as follows:

1. I plan to create the new position of Year 11 Student Welfare Coordinator as an internal appointment. This is in recognition of the fact that there is a great deal of work assisting Year 12 in their HSC year and so it would be better separating this role. Next year's Year 11 is also a bigger year group and they will benefit from welfare support and leadership development.
2. It appears highly likely that we will introduce another class in the Junior School due to a significant increase in enrolments for next year. If this occurs, it will mean having six classes with single stream Kindergarten to Year 4 and a Stage 3 class. I hope to advertise for this position in the next few weeks once enrolment numbers are clearly evident.
3. It is also highly probable that the Junior Boys' Boarding will continue to operate as it has done this year as separate from Bulkeley House. Mr John Ryan has been exceptional in this role but concludes his time with us to pursue other interests next year. I am seeking expressions of interest to take on this important role under the direction of the Director of Boarding for our Year 6-8 boy boarders for next year.

We are very fortunate at The Scots School to attract excellent applicants for advertised roles; this year is no exception. I look forward to welcoming these new staff to the school next year and wish them well as they prepare to join the staff.

The Scots School hosted the Mighty Minds Muster once again last week as we have done for the last 12 years. This is an interschool enrichment experience organised and hosted by The Scots Junior School for Stage 3 students in the Central West. Throughout the day students completed exciting and challenging tasks with an emphasis on higher order thinking skills, creativity, originality and teamwork. The aim of the day is for the students to enjoy participating in stimulating and challenging tasks involving a wide range of thinking activities from Mathematics, Engineering tasks, Speeches, Song Writing and much more. It was a delight for me to spend a little time amongst them last Thursday to see how much fun they were having as they engaged in deep thinking and problem solving activities.

I wish to thank Mr Roohan and his staff for their work in hosting this very special event.

Year 12 is either in the middle of their HSC Examinations or a few of them have already finished. One of the things I really enjoy doing is meeting with the Year 12 students in small groups to reflect on their time at The Scots School and on the HSC Examinations. It also provides me with the opportunity to thank them for their many wonderful contributions as school leaders and to discuss their plans for the future.

The Blue, Black & Gold Ball is on Saturday 11 November – less than two weeks away. This is a wonderful whole school event organised superbly by Mrs Belinda Boshier and her helpers. If you haven't been before, I encourage you to arrange a table with friends or contact Belinda Boshier at The Scots School who will find a spot for you possibly on a table with parents from your child's year group.
