White Card Safety Training 'NSW Prepare to Work Safely' Expressions of Interest

Mr Bob Hughes is an experienced trainer in the Bathurst Region, and has conducted White Card training for the past 28 years.

This is the safety training required for any type of construction work, plus highway workers and council workers. It's a good resource for students to have if they are thinking ahead for work placement or summer employment opportunities.

The course would be conducted here at school at a date to be decided, probably in early Term Two. The cost is \$100 per student. Training and Textbooks are provided, and students obtain a Statement of Attainment plus a NSW WorkSafe certificate. Students must be 14 years of age or over.

CADETS

The Scots School Cadet Unit (TSSBCU) was invited to commemorate the Nurses of The *SS Vyner Brooke*. The service was held in the presence of his Excellency the Honorable Sir Peter Cosgrove AK MC (Retd), Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

TSSBCU was represented by CUO Libby Balzke, CUO Julia Ross, RSM Jaime Balzke, WO2 Josh Van Essen, CPL Caiban Lucas, CPL Daniel Allen-Ford and CPL Jack Kiernan. The Unit was honored to be invited to this memorable service. The nurses who have lost their lives in the service of others can be overlooked at times when remembering the War. A large audience for the service showed the appreciation of Military and Civilian nurses in the past and present. I encourage people to attend these services that commemorate the people who have fought for our country, it is a great way to expand your knowledge and to also appreciate the country that we live in

The SS Vyner Brooke

In February 1942, during the Japanese Army advance a ship, The *SS Vyner Brooke*, left Singapore Harbour. The ship was carrying 181 passengers, a large majority being women and their children; Australian and British Soldiers and the last 65 Australian Nurses and Physiotherapists in Singapore. Mid-afternoon on the 13th of February, the *Vyner Brooke* attacked by several Japanese aircraft. The ship was hit by bombs and sank within the hour.

From the 181 passengers aboard the ship there was a large majority that died, 12 nurse drowned and some floated away on life boats or debris. There were 21 nurses that survived the attack, and then were murdered on Radji Beach, and 32 became prisoners of war. Eight nurses died before liberation of the PoW camps at the end of the war. One of the nurses who died in the sea was Sister Mary Dorothea Clarke of 2/13 Australian General Hospital, Singapore, who was from Rylstone NSW.

Fundamental Movement Skills for PE and Sport

In our weekly PE sessions students have been developing fundamental movement skills in throwing, catching and striking. On Friday they had the opportunity to put these skills into practice with a variety of sport.

Children will use their arm to make a slithering snake whilst saying s,s,s,s,s,s,s. During our morning art session, the students will be making many creations that begin with our sound.

We will also continue to explore colours, shapes and the numbers 1-5 throughout this term.
