This year our results were again fabulous and they are due to a number of factors. This is a team and the every member of the team deserves full credit. The team exists of a number of groups of people of whom I would like to sincerely thank.

Firstly to the students – these students are phenomenal – the work, commitment, maturity, leadership and dedication they show is amazing – two mornings a week they turn up to cattle training at 7.00am – always with a smile, always with a willingness to work hard. The word ‘proud’ doesn’t seem to be enough – they are a credit to themselves, their parents and the school and should be an inspiration and role model to all!!

Secondly, to our parent helpers: Leigh Scott, Brett Cranston, Lesley Kidd, Louise Warry, Shane Ryan, Sue Webb – these parents are always on hand to help – team this size cannot be run without help and help and support (and a whole lot of fun) is what these parents bring to this team. Thank you from the bottom of my heart!!

Thirdly, our cattle producers who entrust us with their superior genetics – Summit Livestock (Hayden and Jasmine Green) from Uranquinty, Leigh and Lynda Scott from Meadowflat, Rob Bennie from Orange, David Searle from Springside, Phil Kirk from Wilworral Limousins, Peak Hill, Lara Quealy from Trangie, Gilmandyke Angus from Orange and Tondara Herefords from Jerilderie all supplied us with quality steers. This year we were proud to exhibit 2 ‘home grown’ Limousin steers from our very own TSS Limousin Stud.

Finally, to our school – Mr Gates fully supports this program and is often seen at cattle training watching the students and in his 8 years as Head of The Scots School he has attended 8 Sydney Royal Easter Show Steer Judging Days. We are very grateful of his and the rest of the schools support. Mr Bruce Inwood, our new farm hand has also been an integral part of the success of this team as his work ‘behind the scenes’ is exceptional and we all thank him for his support.

So our results were amazing. The competition was stiff this year and the numbers massive. To achieve the following results is attributed to a ‘team effort’. A summary of the results is as follows:

Claudia Humphries and Ike Starr Limousin steer S3, placed 3rd place in class 3 with a Limousin steer from Wilworril Limousins

Hugo Humphries and Jorja Hazel’s Limousin steer, S17, placed 4th in class 6 with a Limousin steer from Summit Livestock Maya Brooking, Lillian Oke and Zoe Stuarts’ Limousin steer S7 received a Highly Commended with a Scots homebred steer

Sophie Bingley and Sacha Spence Limousin steer, S13 took out 3rd in class 9 with another Scots homebred steer whilst Jake Mawhood and Aly Cranston’s Angus steer S16 took out 4th place with one of the Mawhoods family bred steers

Felicity Webb and Charlotte Lindsay ‘s Limousin steer, S10 took out 5th place in class 10 with a steer bred by one of our parents, Leigh Scott whilst Lachie Smith’s Angus steer, S19 bred by Gilmandyke Angus took out 6th place

Moving into the Heavyweight classes which were massive in numbers, Lizzie Woodhouse and Courtney Roberts Limousin steer S1 bred by Summit Livestock took out 2nd place in class 11 and in class 12 Kirilee Scots Limousin steer, S11 bred by her father also took out 2nd place.

Rosie Webb and Lachie Woods Limousin steer S2, again from Summit Livestock took out Highly Commended in class 13 whilst Olivia Warry and Will Thomas’ Limousin steer S4 took out another of the Highly Commended Ribbons with a steer bred by Wilworril Limousins

In the Junior Parader’s competition, Joshua Kidd represented the school in the U13 class and Rosie Webb in the School Parader’s. Joshua paraded with professionalism and did a fabulous job whilst Rosie Webb showed off her years of practise to take out 3rd place in a very tough class.

At the ‘real’ end of the competition our carcasses were judged and our results again exceptional. These results are not only due to the many months of hard work along with fabulous genetics but also the ‘little things’ the kids work on during the season that many don’t see!! AND TO TOP IT OFF **‘MOST SUCCESSFUL SCHOOL STEER EXHIBITOR’** WINNING THE EVE CULLEN MEMORIAL TROPHY AND \$1000 which means a lot to me personally as I showed with Eve Cullen for many many years prior to beginning at Scots prior to her passing.

As I write this our school’s stud cattle are currently calving and we already have 2 young bull calves who will be in our team next year when we have our first year exhibiting as **SCOTS ASC COLLEGE**. Our aim is to make our team each year with at least half the animals being ‘home bred’ – another challenge and opportunity for our students to be involved in developing their own genetics and to prove their worth in this prestigious competition. Not only are the students selecting next year’s animals from our own calves, they are also selecting semen to Artificially Inseminate the cows early in Term 2 for our 2020 team. Looking to a very exciting future!!!!

So thank you to all involved and to the school for supporting this program.



