Family conflict can get scary!

Joseph's brothers hated him so much they sold him into slavery. However, years later when Joseph was in the position to take revenge he said:

*"Please, come closer." So they came closer. And he said again, "I am Joseph, your brother, whom you sold into slavery in Egypt. 




**Congratulations from the Agriculture Department to.....**
