1. The Bible, encouraging students to strive to grow their knowledge;
2. The Red and Blue pages of the Bible, celebrating diversity within the College;
3. The Lion, encouraging students to be strong and courageous, and not to be afraid or discouraged;
4. The Cross of Christ, encouraging students to show compassion and grace towards others, and to grow in perseverance, character and hope;
5. The Southern Cross, representing the reach of the College across Australia and beyond; and
6. The words '*All For Christ*', affirming the College's mission as a ministry of the Presbyterian Church in New South Wales.

While the language explaining the crest reflects strongly the Christian mission of the new school, the values outlined through the images are timeless and applicable to all who come into the College to work, study or play, irrespective of their beliefs or cultural backgrounds.

Our vision is to develop a learning environment that is safe and which celebrates a love of learning and the achievement of the potential in every person, whether they be student or staff member.

Over the next few months, the new School Board will be developing a strategic plan that is future-focused and which connects the College to the Church's other colleges and schools across New South Wales, as well as to the best communities of knowledge and practice globally.
