From the Headmaster . . .

August 29 marks one year since the announcement that the Presbyterian Church was intending to purchase All Saints' College with the intention to integrate two wonderful schools. In the last year, an enormous amount of work has taken place to bring the two schools together for the beginning of 2019. I wish to thank all the parents, students and staff who have contributed through integration forums, the two Parent and Friends' Associations and in many other ways. I also wish to acknowledge the increased workload on all staff as they prepare to move campuses, review and integrate teaching programs and prepare to work together next year. I particularly wish to acknowledge the enormous increase in workload for Ms Leaf, Mr Jackman, Mr Jones and Mr Roohan in their leadership roles in preparation for next year. I ask parents and students to be conscious of this and to support them in their work.

I encourage all parents to support the All Saints' Spring Fair on Sunday 9 September. The All Saints' P & F are working very hard in preparation for this annual event and it provides an excellent opportunity to showcase the school to the Scots community and to the wider community too. There will be an opportunity to visit the facilities and to meet with staff during this day. A short celebration will be a part of the day at 11:30 am to officially recognise the coming together of two wonderful independent schools. We would really like the two school communities to come together at this time. An opportunity will also be provided for the All Saints' community to visit the Scots Campus at an Open Day organised for Saturday 27 October.

Parents will most probably become aware of increased advertising to promote Scots All Saints College leading up to the Spring Fair and for the rest of the year. In the last week, students and past students have been involved in filming at both campuses for a special video looking at our past and into the future to celebrate the wonderful community spirit. I particularly wish to thank John Cranfield (All Saints' old boy) and Tim Hector (Scots old boy) for their generosity in agreeing to be interviewed about the heritage of their two respective schools. The students have been wonderful too in agreeing to be interviewed and engaging in integration activities for the filming. This film will be revealed at the special ceremony.

I encourage all parents to continue to review the FAQ document on the school website over the next few months. This document is being regularly updated as decisions are announced to the school community and this is a way to have many of your questions answered.

Last weekend was a Parent Weekend for students at the Scots Campus with the Netball and Rugby Dinners on Friday and Saturday night and the Foundation Day Chapel Service on Sunday. I wish to thank everyone involved in these very special last events for the Scots School. I was particularly impressed with the excellent speeches delivered by all the team captains at the two dinners. The Foundation Day Chapel Service revisited the story of the commencement of The Scots School in the historical context of the Second World War. Two staff, Mr Ryan Barcham and Mr Ian Doney, poignantly captured important aspects of the Christian foundation of the School. I also wish to thank the Chaplain for his very relevant sermon in the context of the occasion.

At All Saints' College, the two boarding houses enjoyed dinner together on Friday and Saturday nights respectively. From all reports, they were both very successful events. I was disappointed I was not able to attend due to the clash with the Netball and Rugby Dinners at Scots but I have promised the boarders I will visit them one evening soon to talk about next year and the integration of all boarders on the Scots Campus.

We are right at the beginning of the Eisteddfod Season in Bathurst and many of our students at both campuses will be involved. I always look forward to getting along to some sections every year to see the students in action. The Infants School at All Saints' College (Years K, 1, 2) has started us off very well with second place in the Infants Verse Reciting this week. I saw them do a final rehearsal at last week's Assembly and I was very impressed.

Integration Update -

Integration Update - 30 August 2018

Can the new School Crest be changed?

Thank you to those parents who have emailed me excited to see the new crest for the College.

However, since announcing it last week, David Gates and I have also received a number of emails and communications objecting to it.

Unfortunately, whilst understanding that parents, students or Old Boys or Old Girls may not be happy with it, or parts of it, it is unable to be changed. The crest was presented and discussed at the General Assembly in July as part of the approval of the merger of the two schools to form Scots All Saints College. Now that it has been launched to the school community and externally, it is being included in all branding and promotion materials for the new school, such as a soon to be released Facebook page, marketing campaign and website. We will keep you updated as these important communication channels are developed.

What is happening about the new uniform?

As was the case with the new name for the school, some colour elements of the design of the new uniform are causing great anxiety and anguish in one or other of the two school communities. On behalf of the School Board, they understand and deeply appreciate that some of the decisions are difficult to reconcile between the two. Having said this, I am very pleased to advise that most elements have now been agreed to and that the Board is close to resolving the final combinations of colours and elements. The Board has also signed the contract for the manufacture and supply of the new uniform. Unlike previous practices in both schools, the supplier will also manage the Uniform Shop, thereby reducing the need for the new school to hold stock, which will provide substantial benefits to the school, and to parents. Subject to resolution of the final uniform design by the Board, the new uniforms will be announced and we will be able to advise planned timelines for supply and availability.

What is the vision for the new school?

I have been asked again about the vision for Scots All Saints College. While the General Assembly has a clear mission and purpose for the new school, the College's Vision and Strategic Plan will be developed by the School Board ahead of the start of the school in 2019. However, core guiding principles of the vision have been consistently communicated at a number of different parent, student and staff forums over the past twelve months and presented to the General Assembly.

The guiding principles for the vision remain as follows:

1. The vision will begin with a child focus
2. The vision will focus on educational excellence
3. The vision will be Christ-centred
4. The vision will be a new future for both schools

The vision will reinforce the new school as a leading co-educational boarding and day school for all students. Our aspiration as a Church for all our schools is that all students, irrespective of where their careers or employment lead them in the future, will grow in grace and knowledge and be open to the possibilities of global knowledge and best practice. Our prayer is that they also grow in their faith in Christ.

What is happening about promoting the new school?

An immense amount of work is being undertaken by various groups in the school, whereby communications will be increasingly broader than simply through this Integration Update. Indeed, all communications and promotions for the new school have become the responsibility of the new Communication, Marketing and Enrolment Committee of the School Board. This Committee is being very capably supported by Lynda Ireland from Scots and Lisa Ellery from All Saints working with external suppliers and consultants. I would like to acknowledge the huge amount of

work, love and care being provided over recent weeks and months by these extremely gifted individuals and thank them for their preparation of the launch of the new school at the Special Ceremony as part of Spring Fair on Sunday week. I thank God that Scots All Saints College has been blessed with parents and staff who are passionate to help to bring these two schools together as one new school from 2019.


