## **Integration Update 20 September**

### **Future Integration Updates from the Communications Team and Headmaster**

Following two very busy school terms, this will be my last Integration Update as I pass the baton to the Headmaster and Communications team. It has been my pleasure to act on behalf of the many committees and individuals, including many parents who have been working assiduously behind the scenes getting everything ready. This includes the Headmaster, the Executive Team and a number of teachers, who have been working tirelessly on a wide range of operational changes, from timetabling to location of school lockers to the logistics of ensuring safe and regular bus transport between campuses next year.

They deserve a huge vote of thanks, and I encourage you to support them in their endeavours during Term 4 for the benefit of all their students.

Term 4 will be a term of exams and closure, of sadness, and of hope for the future. There are a number of celebrations being planned across both schools and it will be a time of reflection, thanks and praise for past achievements, and prayers for future achievements as we look towards a very bright new future.

### **Change of name from 'School Board' to 'College Council'**

Since the announcement of the new name, Scots All Saints College, some ambiguity has arisen over the use of the term 'School Board' as the governing body for the College. As a result, the School Board (as it has been referred to in all previous communications) will now be called the 'College Council'. This change aligns the term 'College Council' with the College Councils at The Scots College, Presbyterian Ladies' College Sydney and Presbyterian Ladies' College Armidale.

### **New School Plaid and Uniform**

We have received overwhelming approval for the new plaid and uniforms announced last week. I can say that the actual material sample of the plaid is even better than the photo portrays. I think the girls will quickly be proud of wearing the new kilt and the boys will be equally proud with their smart new uniforms. Providing K-4 students with the option to wear either the blue jumper or the red jumper has also received very positive parent support. I can confirm that the manufacturer continues to assure us that the uniform will be available from the beginning on the New Year. But, we don't have a date at the moment. We will keep you informed as soon as we know more. Parents are also keen to see the sports uniforms and other accessories. We understand this, but the design process is taking time to ensure the best possible outcomes. It is challenging, and I ask on behalf of the designers and the College Council to bear with us in this process.

### **New integrated Information, Communication and Technology (ICT)**

The ICT team has been working on upgrading the infrastructure and computers on both campuses in preparation for 2019. Key initiatives that are underway include:

- Server upgrade for the Scots campus that will increase the reliability and protection of data
- New Wi-Fi access points across both campuses
- A new NBN connection into the ASC Campus
- A new range of iPads for the K-4 Junior School
- Updated school laptops for Years 5-6
- A revised BYOD program for Years 7-12 (to be released next week)
- Staff computer upgrades
- A revised Canvas platform for teaching and learning, along with teacher training and support for key platforms

These upgrades and new technology will benefit all students and teachers, and will position the College at the forefront of Information Technology as a platform for educational excellence.

## **New Boarding Facilities**

The new girls' Boarding House, Thompson House, is near completion, freshly painted and carpeted with brand new study and bed facilities. I'm told it looks terrific, although the proof will be in the feedback from the girls and their parents as they inspect them during next term ahead of 2019.



We are still upgrading the boys' boarding facilities to provide single room accommodation for all Year 12 students, which will be completed during Term 4.

## Senior School Writing Group . . .

### ALCOHOL

How much alcohol is safe to drink? Well, you've probably heard several answers to this question.

"Oh, half a glass of wine does more good than harm"

"All depends on the individual"

"As long as you have it in moderation, it's harmless"

All old age adages. But research suggests something different.

Dr Max Griswold claims every gram of alcohol opens a small door to several different health risks. We all aware that alcohol is a toxin, and just like any other toxin – is not meant to be ingested. But as Dr Griswold says, there's a myth that drinking just a certain amount provides a wide array of benefits. While that may be true, cardiovascular disease, cancers, intentional and unintentional injuries, obesity, diabetes and pancreatitis are all at increased risk. Not only with binge drinking, but possibly even with a standard drink daily. This is concerning as up to 1 in 3 people globally, consume alcohol in varying amounts. The average being 0.73 for women and 1.7 for men. Areas with the highest death rates such as Eastern European, or Central Asian regions, specifically Russia, Ukraine, Lithuania, Belarus, Mongolia, Latvia, and Kazakhstan, are consequently the countries with the highest death rates from alcohol consumption.

Doctors and researchers have also recognised the way the way the substance is advertised and are pushing to have that reduced. Some argue that propaganda does more than advertise alcohol, it makes non-consumers feel excluded. One of the reasons why the alcohol epidemic continues to rise. 'Less is better, none is best.' Emmanuela Gakidou says as she encourages reducing or abstaining from alcohol completely.

Many now believe doing so will lead to better health in the community.

In order to complete the Award, students will need to have logged all the required hours on the Online Record Book and then emailed the final report to their Assessor for the activity. The Assessor will complete a short report indicating that you have completed all required hours and have achieved the goal you set with them at the beginning of the Award. The completed and signed report will then be sent to Mr Harris by email, or in hard copy, and be approved by both the school and the International Duke of Edinburgh Award Office.
