

Integration Update #22 –Term 4, Week 4

House Names for Scots All Saints College

Following feedback from staff, students and parents, it was decided to introduce five new house names for Scots All Saints College. Five houses were agreed to accommodate an expected 450 students in Years 7-12 and 250 in K-Year 6. Even though we are splitting into Junior, Middle and Senior School next year, the sporting competitions will still be K-6 and 7-12.

The criteria provided to the House Names Committee were as follows:

- To choose people of honour for the house names. The names should identify well known Australians with values we wish to develop and see reflected in our students and in the new College.
- Those chosen must have been long term contributors and stood the test of time as honourable Australians.
- The five house names are to be representative of a range of fields of endeavour, for example, sport, education, the arts, service to humanity, Christian ministry.
- None of the five are to have any direct link to either ASC or TSS, that is, not an old boy/girl or past Headmaster.
- Each will be preferably Christian in their belief and service to humanity.
- A brief biographical sketch which is provided for each honoured Australian must clearly identify at least one specific value we wish to encourage in our students such as service, courage, standing up for what is right or the spirit of discovery.
- The five house names must reflect the coeducational nature of the school by including a minimum of two males and two females.

The new house names were announced to all students on Tuesday. The Scots All Saints College house names will be referred by the surname of famous Australians. The new houses, the house colours and the first Senior School House Captains are as follows:

BRIAN BOOTH (1933-) is a former Australian cricketer who played in 29 Tests from 1961 to 1966. He also represented Australia in Hockey including at the 1956 Melbourne Olympics. He was a school teacher and teacher educator at Sydney Teachers' College in his professional life. Brian Booth was a devout Christian and an Anglican lay-preacher, described by one journalist in this way: "If a prize were offered for fair play and sportsmanship among Australia's post-war cricketers, Brian Booth ought to win it hands down."

EDITH COWAN (1861-1932) Former Member of the Western Australian Legislative Assembly, Edith Cowan OBE was an Australian social reformer who worked for the rights and welfare of women and children. She is best known as the first Australian woman to serve as a member of parliament. She was a true Australian pioneer in many ways. She was active in the Anglican Church and was the first female member of the Anglican Social Questions Committee.

BETTY CUTHBERT (1938-2017) was an Australian athlete who won four gold medals at the Melbourne and Tokyo Olympics in the 100m, 200M and 400M events. She was known as Australia’s Golden Girl. In later life Betty Cuthbert developed multiple sclerosis. She was helped in her struggle with the disease by her strong Christian faith, and used her public profile to support other sufferers from the condition, and assisted in the founding of MS Research Australia.

SIR EDWARD “Weary”DUNLOP (1907-1993) was a doctor, and a member of the Presbyterian Church. He played Rugby Union for the Wallabies in wins against the All Blacks in the Bledisloe Cup. In 1935 he joined the Army Medical Corps. His unit was sent to Java, where he was captured by the Japanese. In prison camps at Changi and on the Burma railway he was notable for his work in treating sick and dying POWs with whatever resources he could gather. After the war he was publicly involved in a number of health, welfare and educational organisations, and in promoting reconciliation with the Japanese.

DOUGLAS MAWSON (1882-1952) had the brilliant brain of a scientist but is remembered for making one of the most courageous solo journeys by any Australian adventurer. In 1911, he headed south to chart the Antarctic coastline. But on a dangerous trek tragedy struck. One of his partners plummeted down an ice crevasse and the other died from physical exertion. Mawson was left alone 850km from base camp. On his brutal journey back he slipped down a crevasse but managed to haul himself to safety. For 30 days he battled frostbite and hunger as the whipping wind tried to break his spirit. Finally, he reached supplies and his miraculous escape became news around the world.

**Freedom of the City Parade - Saturday, 10th November at 11:30 a.m.

The Scots School Pipes and Drums were granted Freedom of the City of Bathurst on 4th March 1996, in recognition of the 50th Anniversary of the school. The granting of a 'freedom of the city' means that the band can march through the City of Bathurst, unobstructed, with drums playing and flags unfurled. Historically, the drums and flags were thought of as signs of invasion. The granting of the freedom of the city to The Scots School Pipes & Drums in 1996 was one of only a few such 'freedoms' granted anywhere in Australia. It was a great honour for our Band.

Assessment

Mr Phil Cant, our Head of Student Enrichment and Support Services has met with each child over the past week and conducted the DIBELS Assessments. DIBELS stands for Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills and involves a set of procedures and measures for assessing the acquisition of a set of K-6 literacy skills, such as phonemic awareness, alphabetic principle, accuracy and fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. The data obtained from these assessments will assist Phil and other members of staff in planning for 2019.

Next week is Assessment Week. Teachers will be conducting end of year assessments. Please avoid any unnecessary absence to ensure your child can complete all tasks with his/ her classmates.

Integration Update

A great deal of work is going on behind the scene at the moment to prepare for the full integration of the two schools in 2019. Mr Jackman and I have been busy finalising calendar dates for the K-8 campus and contents for the 2019 Handbook and student diary. Staffing is also being finalised and a position is currently being advertised for a Junior School Teacher. At this stage we anticipate being double streamed, including in Year 2 where numbers currently stand at 25. It is important that the school is notified of any planned withdrawals as it has the potential to impact class sizes and staffing.

Class teachers from both campuses have had an opportunity to meet and discuss your child's needs and discuss placement into 2019 classes. I've been working closely with Brett Gore, who has been employed by the school to assist in the translocation of the Junior School. This has been a huge task and will ensure that our school is well resourced to start the new calendar year. Curriculum planning is also well underway and we're looking forward to implementing some new and exciting programs in 2019.

SASC Intensive Swimming Lessons – Holiday Program

We will not be offering an intensive learn to swim program during the term this year.

In the absence of an intensive swimming program during the school term we are offering an intensive swimming program during the January school holidays for 2 weeks.

Week 1 from the 7th January to the 11th January, 2019

Week 2 from the 21st January to the 25th January, 2019

The suggested time for the intensive swimming program is from 10 am until 12 midday.

This program will offer something for all the swimming levels of the students from Pre-Kindy to Year 12. For our Learn to Swim students, the lesson will consist of a 1 teacher to one student ratio for a ½ hour lesson at the cost of \$80.00 for the week. If you enrol for the second week it will be \$150 for both weeks.

For the junior school swimmers, we will be running clinics on all strokes in preparation for those that will be competing in our swimming carnivals. For the senior school students, we will also be focussing on carnival preparation which will focus on developing endurance and stroke correction. The cost of these programs will be determined on the number of enrolments.
