From the Headmaster . . .

The Year 12 Valedictory Dinner for the All Saints' Year 12 students, staff and families was an outstanding success from all accounts. This is a wonderful way to celebrate the conclusion of 13 years of schooling and the end of the HSC Examinations. I wish all Year 12 students the very best as they await their results on 13 December and make decisions on their plans for next year.

For The Scots School community, the same night was the occasion of the last Blue, Black and Gold Ball. This is a wonderful whole school community event and this year's attendance was considerably larger than the past. There was a very large contingent of Old Boys and Girls, along with the present Scots community and the graduating Year 12. In all there were 470 in attendance with the entertainment of the Pipe Band and Highland Dancers a real highlight.

I ask all parents to keep a close watch on the Integration Update every week with so much important information being conveyed regarding the new college for next year. I wish to thank the Communications and Marketing Team who have been tireless in their efforts over the last four months in preparation for next year. Mrs Mel Monico has been working with us part time as a consultant to lead the CME Team however, I am delighted to announce that she will be joining the staff from December full time as the Director of Community Engagement & Marketing.

A great deal of staffing adjustment has been ongoing over the last few months with internal appointments for senior staff being confirmed. As a result of an expansion from three classes to four for Years 7, 8 & 9 for next year, it has also been necessary to employ new staff. This process will be completed in the next two weeks and I will be able to announce all new staff to the College at that time. So far I have been very impressed with the high calibre of staff who have applied for teaching positions for next year.

Our enrolment numbers for 2019 are very pleasing with the current position being double stream from Kindergarten to Year 6 and four streams for Years 7-10. Years 11 and 12 are different because of the elective lines however we have a comparable size cohort for Year 12 and a slightly smaller Year 11 cohort. All elective subject lines for Years 9-12 have been determined with extra subject offerings and greater flexibility in terms of the timetable allowing a much greater increase in elective subject offerings for our Senior School students. Enrolment enquiry for next year is still very strong and I am hopeful of being able to confirm the two stream and four stream model as outlined above by the end of the year. I encourage current parents to be supportive of the wonderful possibilities the new College will provide and to encourage friends to consider Scots All Saints College for the education of their children.

I wish the All Saints' students going on their Outdoor Education Experience all the best. Outdoor education provides a wonderful opportunity for personal challenge and growth, leadership development through team work, and an appreciation of our wonderful natural environment. These experiences are incredibly important in the context of a rich and diverse educational experience and it is important that all students attend. The new Year 12 from both schools will join together for a leadership camp in the following week. The purpose of this camp is to prepare them for the rigours of Year 12 and the HSC. I look forward to joining with them and leading them through a session.

The end of the year is drawing close but there is so much else to do and enjoy together. I hope to see many of you at the various events which mark end of year occasions as we give thanks for all that is good.





Day student lunch options for 2019

Dear Parents and Carers,

In preparation for the start of the new school year, the College is requesting you to nominate your preference for lunches in the Dining Hall for your child/ children as soon as possible and before 4 December 2018. This will help staff to plan resources and catering to support nutritious meals for our students. There are two lunch options for your consideration, as follows:

Option 1–Daily lunch provided in the Dining Hall for 2019

This option enables your child to have lunch in the Dining Hall each day during term. If you would like your child to have lunches in the Dining Hall, you will be charged \$400 per student at the beginning of each term. As previously advised, this does not include morning tea. A Lunch Pass will be available on the first day of Term One. Day students will not be permitted to enter the Dining Hall without their Lunch Pass.

Option 2–Bring your own lunch from home

If you decide for your child not to have lunches in the Dining Hall, the lunch fee will not be charged to your account. Parents and carers choosing this option will pack a nutritious lunch each day for their child and provide morning tea. Please understand that casual lunches from the Dining Hall are not available as the College is unable to cater for large fluctuations in numbers which may result in there being insufficient food for our boarding students and the day students who have opted to receive daily lunches in the Dining Hall. On some rare occasions, students are encouraged to talk their teacher who will be able to organise an 'emergency' lunch in the Dining Hall.





SASC Intensive Swimming Lessons – Holiday Program

We will not be offering an intensive learn to swim program during the term this year.

In the absence of an intensive swimming program during the school term we are offering an intensive swimming program during the January school holidays for 2 weeks.

The suggested time for the intensive swimming program is from 10 am until 12 midday.
