I ask all parents to read today's Integration Update which conveys very important information in preparation for the start of next year. I wish to thank the Communications and Marketing Team who have been tireless in their efforts over the last four months in preparation for next year. Mrs Mel Monico has been working with us part time as a consultant to lead the CME Team however, I am delighted to announce that she will be joining the staff from next week full time as the Director of Community Engagement & Marketing.

I wish to thank the staff from both schools who are concluding their time at the two respective schools at the end of the year. I am grateful for their years of service to the two school communities and their care for the children. I wish them well in their future career or for their retirement plans.

Our enrolment numbers for 2019 are very pleasing indeed with double stream from Kindergarten to Year 6 and four streams for Years 7-10 now confirmed. Enrolment enquiry for next year is still very strong with the expectation that we will begin 2019 with over 700 students from Kindergarten to Year 12. This is something I am very excited about because it confirms the faith the current community are placing in the new College, the teaching staff and the integration process. Because of the very recent decision to add another stream in Years 7 to

9, appointments for additional staff are being finalised. However, almost all positions are now in place in terms of staffing and the translocation of staff from one campus to the other will take place in the Christmas break.

I am very excited to be able to announce the appointment of a Careers Development Officer for next year. Mrs Helen Jones has been appointed to the newly developed position of Careers Development Officer at the Senior School of Scots All Saints College. Helen is a highly experienced Careers Advisor who will work closely with our students in preparing them for pathways beyond school. Helen will run careers education classes with all of Year 10 and also work closely with Years 11 & 12 to guide them through the decision making process of thinking about possible career options, university choices, vocational education, work experience and a great deal more. Helen will interview all Year 11 & 12 students throughout their Senior years and track and guide their thinking and planning processes and assist them with their applications. She will also be available to meet with parents so they are able to be involved closely in this process with their children.

An additional part of Helen's role will be to work two nights per week in boarding to assist students during Prep. In addition to prep assistance she will also focus on aspects that will enable them to be more self-directed such as goal setting, organisation for due assessment tasks, personal motivation and more. Helen will also work to assist and guide the young academic tutors who currently spend time assisting the junior boarders and international students. This is the type of support boarding parents have been asking for and I am pleased that we will now have a greater level of academic support available for students during Prep time.

I thoroughly enjoyed the All Saints Valedictory Chapel Service and Dinner last Friday night and the Scots Year 6 Graduation Dinner last night. These were both wonderful events which celebrated student achievement and personal growth. I was impressed by the speeches and performances of the children and the obvious sway they enjoyed each other's company. They are all looking forward to Year 7 and the opportunities a Middle School structure will provide. I wish to acknowledge the parents and staff who put in so much in preparation for these important events.

I look forward to joining with parents, students and staff at various events over the next week which mark the conclusion of our academic year. These events include:

- The Lithgow Campus Christmas Concert and Annual Fete on Friday;
- The Cadet Ceremonial Parade on the Scots Campus on Tuesday afternoon;
- Two Carol services – Scots on Tuesday night and All Saints on Wednesday night;
- Speech Day – Scots on Wednesday and All Saints on Thursday.


Thank you to those who purchased a limited edition Table Runner.

Integration Update #25 – Term 4,

Week 6

As Term 4 draws to a close, this will be the last Integration Update in this form before we start our inaugural year as Scots All Saints College. Work continues to be ready for 2019 on policy and program development, infrastructure upgrades, rebranding and recruitment of new teaching positions and support staff. While our transition will progress well after the final class of 2018, one thing is certain, our new College will be stronger together - offering more subject choice, greater opportunities in academics, physical and social development, student leadership roles, inspired learning through teachers who take the time to care, a positive student wellbeing program tailored to each year group and specialist facilities to enable our students to thrive and grow in their dynamic learning environment. We thank you for joining this journey with us.

Communication Program to be ready for 2019

The Headmaster and Executive Leadership Team will provide important information before Christmas to help you plan your back to school schedule. An online '**Starting in 2019 Commencement Pack**' will answer many of your questions. The Headmaster will email parents an email letter with campus maps, College calendar, uniform price lists, uniform shop opening times, daily schedules, school bus and cross-campus transport, stationary/ textbook/ exercise book requirements, parent handbooks, class structures and staff lists.

Campus reception offices opening dates in the holidays – While students head off for a well-deserved break, office staff will continue to be available to assist. Many office staff and teachers will be relocating to various campuses in preparation for 2019. Please note, reception will be closed from Thursday, 20 December and will reopen on Monday, 7 January 2019.

Face to face conversations - Following feedback from parents, students and teachers, a fresh, new approach to communication will be developed in time for the start of the 2019 school year. Two-way, interactive communication is valued which will be enhanced through online tools as well as face to face forums. Assemblies, teacher-parent interaction, parent involvement in the classroom e.g. Reading groups for Juniors will continue and be valued.

eNewsletters- The College community can expect to receive weekly eNewsletters with a new and improved format to make it easier to find the information you need. It will aim to be more succinct and focus on what's coming up for the week ahead. While student achievements will be highlighted, other channels will be used to support these messages.

Website– the new scotsallsaints.com.au website will be launched in January 2019. Until it is fully functional, a holding site has been created. The two current school websites will continue to provide information on the Integration process such as FAQs, and **Commencement pack** information including a **College calendar, maps, uniform price lists, uniform shop** opening hours in the holidays, daily schedules, Dining Hall meal options, bus information, staff lists and more.

Year book– a new annual publication to celebrate the highlights and achievements throughout the College year.

Social media channels will also play a role to keep you informed sharing photos and stories from students in their daily activities. Current school Facebook pages are planned to fold into the new @scotsallsaints Facebook page so please make sure you 'like' our new page ASAP. Our YouTube channel is also available with our latest films – search for Scots All Saints College. Look out for Instagram and Twitter coming soon.

College Calendar – This will initially be provided online as a downloadable document before Christmas and printed copies will be provided one per family on the first day of Term 1, 2019. The College **Major events calendar** fridge magnet will be presented to students before the end of term so check your eldest child's bag for these key dates.

Student Diaries – one per student will be available for Day 1, Term 1, 2019. Key information will be presented by campus. Diaries encourage daily communication with teachers.

Online tools

- **Canvas** already used by Middle and Senior School year groups will be extended across SASC to help students plan study and homework with an online calendar, assignment and assessment schedules and parent and teacher dialogue and feedback.

- **CareMonkey** will be rolled out across Scots All Saints College. This intuitive online tool enables parents to set up a secure profile for each child to inform the school of health information and their preferences, with notifications from the College directly to parents' email boxes to manage student welfare, permissions, excursions and leave requirements.

- **Boardingware** is the most secure and easy-to-use boarding student welfare tool which will be used to support the growing number of our boarding families. Boardingware is used to track, monitor and manage permissions and authority for leave to ensure safety and security of our boarding students.

More information and how to guides will be provided to help parents and students to maximise the communications tools on offer.





All of year 9 travelled down to the Kangaroo Valley to experience and complete the Bronze journey part of the Duke of Edenborough campaign. The year was divided into three groups, with their coordinated teacher. Two groups started at one end of the valley, while the other group started at the other end. We headed off on an unforgettable journey of canoeing. The groups set camp at different sites, challenging us to cook, clean, set up and survive in the harsh conditions of the bush.

The next day the groups set off from their campsites bright and early. Group 3 canoed through the submerged forest. Day 2 consisted of learning the very important canoeing skills such as capsizing, and how to flip it back over properly. We also learnt how to deal with first aid in different scenarios. We then continued in our separate groups paddling along the river for about 10km.

Day 3 was the start of the Duke of Ed assessment. Key points that were closely looked at, and very important in the bush, were navigation and team work. The last day was a slow paddle to our final destination. Mathematics Competition Results

The results of four Mathematics Competitions have finally arrived and certificates of achievement were presented at assembly. **The Australasian Problem Solving Mathematical Olympiads** are a series of time limited examinations conducted over 5 months. Congratulations to our “Top 25% Achievers”: Sarah-Joy Day (Year 7), Jessica Mills (Year 7) and Jack Dickenson (Year 8). Sarah-Joy Day was awarded the trophy for the highest overall score.

The Mathematics Challenge for Young Australians involves a 4 week Challenge stage and a 16 week Enrichment stage. The results for the Challenge stage were: High Distinction to Sarah-Joy Day (Year 7) and Credits to Dylan Boniface (Year 8), Jessica Mills (Year 7) and Ellie Moorhead (Year 8). Sarah-Joy Day also achieved a High Distinction in the Enrichment stage of the Mathematics Challenge.

The Australian Mathematics Competition was held in August. Courtney Roberts (Year 8) achieved a Distinction and Credits were awarded to Sophie Baker (Year 7), Sarah-Joy Day (Year 7), Jessica Mills (Year 7), Dylan Boniface (Year 8), Jack Dickenson (Year 8), David Hardie (Year 8), Jack McCudden (Year 8) and Sarah Mills (Year 8). Courtney Roberts, Xavier Adams and Elspeth Hardie also each received an Achievement Award for Mathematics at assembly. Earlier this month our Year 7/8 Mathematics Team participated strongly in the HICES Mathematics tournament.

HICES Mathematics Tournament at Blue Mountains Grammar

On Tuesday 13th November, 8 of our students travelled to Blue Mountains Grammar School to participate as two teams in the 2018 HICES Mathematics Tournament. Both teams performed well against the other schools and enjoyed a challenging day filled with mathematical problem solving. The day consisted of 3 sessions of competitive problem solving with students sometimes working collaboratively, sometimes independently. There were also two mixer sessions where students from 4 different schools would come together to complete a selection of problems.
