There were other athletics type events run by other volunteers such as sprint races, hurdles, shot put, and wheelchair races. Essential Energy sponsored the event which was co-ordinated by Bathurst Independent Living Skills (BILS) with one of our parents, Mrs Robyn Wyatt (Kieran Ball's mother) very much involved. Mr Adams said "I was amazed at how well our students handled the co-ordination and demonstration of their activities. 




