Scotland Tour – Preliminary Report

This is a short report letting you know; we're back!
There will be comprehensive reports for next week's Highlander once everyone has recovered from jet lag.

The Tour was, I believe, a great success. The experience gained by each individual was invaluable. Many of the students have already decided on gap years in Scotland.

Although we didn't achieve as well as we might have hoped in the World Championships we walked the ground and gave it a great shake. The competition was extremely tough against more than twenty very good Novice Juvenile bands many of whom play the World Championships every year.

Our band was invited with a number of other bands from all grades and from around the world to march past to give the 'Salute to the Chieftain'. To see them take their place out of something like 210 bands, in front of an estimated 30,000 people and to hear "The Scots School Bathurst Australia" was quite something.

The Pipes and Drums did achieve a 5th placing at North Berwick Highland Games straight off the plane and in rain like we haven't seen in Australia for many years and a 4th place at the Crieff Highland Games in a Grade 4 competition against both NJ and adult bands.

Throughout the Tour the students conducted themselves in the best possible manner at all times. Their attitude, application, willingness to participate and behaviour were outstanding. Congratulations.

I would like to thank everyone involved in the Tour for their support including; Mr Richards and Mrs Fleming, Mrs Garland and Mr MacKenzie, Parents and Helpers on Tour, those who kept things ticking over at home and the students who made all the hard work worthwhile. Thankyou
