The prime focus for Year 12 this week is study seminars extending across Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The staff has prepared thoughtfully for these seminars, wishing to provide optimum support for the students in their examination preparation.

Finally, some words of advice to Year 12 as they complete their study preparation.

*Set realistic goals for each day's study.

*Make your own notes for each subject and for each topic. Make glossary lists for each subject.

*After you have made your notes (and learnt them), complete practise questions sticking to the advised time length. Review your progress, learn your notes again, and do another practise question so that your confidence is built.

*Build a reward structure into each day: some television time, a trip to the movies or a chat to a friend. Remember, a reward is only a reward if it is earned. If you have not done any work that day, the "reward" is actually an escape mechanism or a diversionary tactic.

*Liaise with your teachers about your progress.

*Safeguard your relationships with your parents and friends through being calm and considerate and going the jobs that are normally expected of you.

*Remember, you are valued by your school. Your results represent a set of numbers, not a judgment on your character.

What a wonderful world indeed! On Friday evening over 400 guests were entertained by a variety of high quality items presented by the students of Pre Prep and the Preparatory School with live music by Mrs Garland and the Senior School concert band.

The show began with a Pop song and a Taekwondo dance by our Keystone visitors. It was a very colourful display with the children dressed in their national costume the 'hambok.'

The Pre Prep item explored the world under the sea through a variety of songs and colourful creatures. Whales, jellyfish, octopi, colourful fish, penguins, sailors and a yellow submarine delighted the audience.

From under the sea to Antarctica and the land of Happy Feet we were taken by K/1/2 as 39 black and white penguins took to the stage. It was a slick and dazzling four scene performance which brought the house down! Great dancing, catchy tunes, colourful props and smiling faces characterised a fun filled and enjoyable item.

Stage 2 took the audience into the Dreaming with their interpretation of the story 'The Rainbow Serpent.' A colourful rainbow serpent and the children dressed in red, white and black told the story through mime and movement. Mr Byron Christie narrated the story which concluded with a song from Brother which is a famed band made up of two former members of The Scots School who play didgeridoo and bagpipes in their compositions. From Indonesia came the Stage 3 story Ramayana. Delicate dancing maidens and monkey men in battle featured in the presentation which was cleverly narrated in English and Indonesian. FIRST XI CRICKET

Scots vs All Saints Trial Match

The most remarkable thing about last Saturday's trial match with All Saints was just how cold it was. 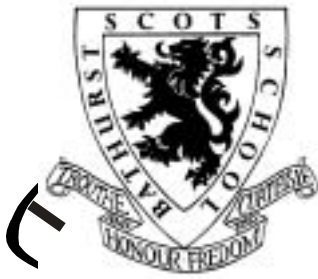
