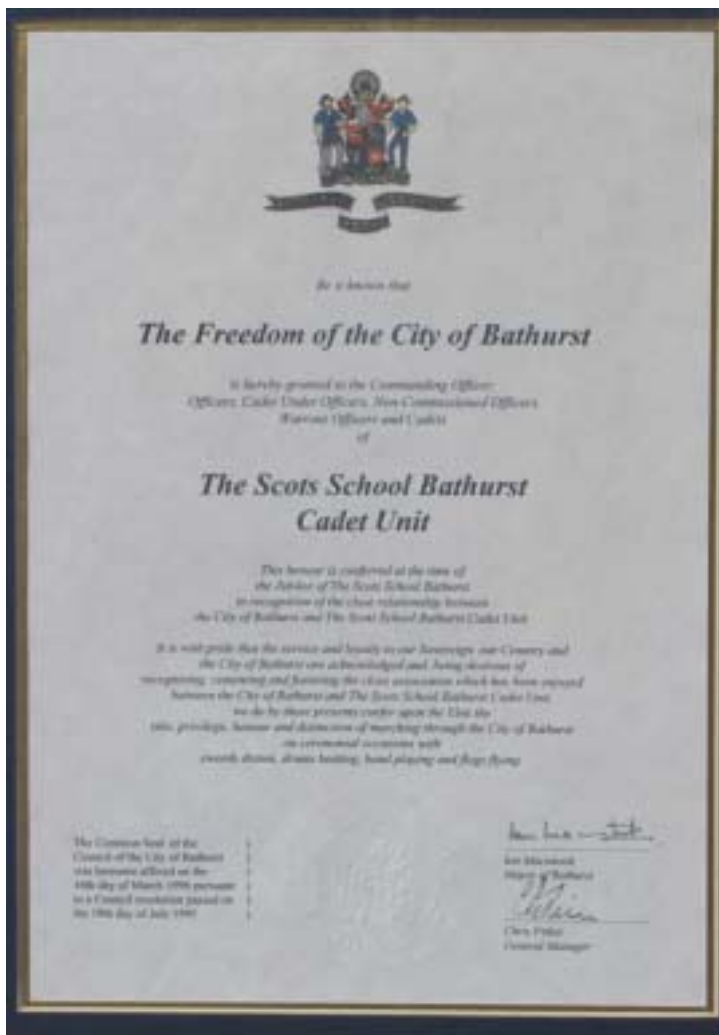

## NSW Competitions

Our students in Years 3 to 6 are entered in these competitions annually in the areas of English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Writing. By doing the competitions it gives students experience in test conditions and reading test papers which they will experience throughout their education. Many schools only enter what are determined to be the top academic students and the competitions are designed to test the upper

echelons of participants, which means that state averages may be unusually high. Therefore results need to be viewed in that context as opposed to NAPLAN testing which tests all students in Australia at designated levels.

Results are beginning to arrive at school and certificates presented to students. Detailed information relating to individual performance is retained at the school for tracking purposes. If you would like more information about your child's performance in a particular competition, please contact classroom teachers.
